I have a Bachelor's degree and over 15 years of clerical-administrative experience. During 2013, I was working in an office until I suddenly lost my job and eventually my apartment. I never thought I would be homeless — it was quite a shock.

When I first came to DuPage**Pads**, my Case Manager immediately referred me to the Employment Coordinator who assessed my skills, advised me on resume writing and interview techniques and helped me search for job opportunities that met my experience with their more than 30 community employers. My interview went really well and I got the job! Now I'm a recruiter for a bus company, which allows me the rewarding opportunity to come back to DuPage**Pads** and help others find a career. I have definitely been inspired and want to give back to DuPage**Pads**.

Community Comes Together for Overnight Site after Flood

Heavy rains flooded the basement of First Congregational United Church of Christ in Downers Grove last year. Consequently, the church's DuPage**Pads** overnight site faced immense water damage.

However this storm cloud truly had a silver lining, as First Congregational turned the flood into an opportunity to update their site amenities to better serve DuPage**Pads**' clients.

Prior to the flood, the church had one shower, washer and dryer. The redesigned space now has four showers and two large washers and dryers. "Before we could do about ten showers a night, now we will be able to do four times that amount," Site Coordinator Tom Williams said.

While insurance covered the flood damage, the church had to raise \$82,000 for the enhancements. "What amazed me was the wide-spread community support we received. We communicated that we were raising money for this project and one amazing surprise after another kept coming in," said Williams.

Help came from a Downers Grove Village Trustee, Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, St. Joseph's Catholic Church, St. Paul United Church of Christ, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, the Downers Grove Junior Women's Club and "100 Women Who Care". Fundraisers were held at First Congregational Church, Tom & Eddies in Lombard and by Downers Grove North High School students.

"When we were considering redoing the space we thought, 'What is the price of human dignity?' If we give people a respectful place to shower and clean up or if they could have clean clothes for a job interview or to take their kids to school, we are helping to restore dignity," said First Congregational's Pastor, Scott Oberle.

"We have found that the greatest gift you can give is letting people know 'you are not alone,' and our renovated space is a reflection of that."
