

DuPagePads Responds to Frigid Temperatures

With plummeting temperatures and snowfall this winter, the safety of the families and individuals we serve is our main concern. Waiting for public transportation in the extreme cold and snow is dangerous, especially for children.

As a result of last winter's subzero temperatures and constant snowfall, DuPage**Pads** has adopted a policy to keep the safety of program participants who are homeless a top priority. During severe winter weather advisories:

- DuPagePads staff ensures everyone has warm coats, hats, gloves and even supplies hand and feet warmers.
- All individuals are admitted at the Interim (Overnight) Housing sites despite capacity limits.
- Families and individuals are transported between the Client Service Center in Wheaton, which remains open until 4:oopm and the shelter sites which open early.

Despite the weather and the cost of public transit, **DuPagePads** is committed to finding solutions to ensure that transportation barriers do not prohibit individuals from receiving shelter, food and support services.

New Program: Short-Term Housing Employment Program

"I worked the late shift which just ended at 4:00am. The overnight sites close at 7:00am and I have nowhere to sleep. I try to nap where I can," one woman said at a DuPage**Pads** focus group for participants who are employed.

To address this problem, DuPage**Pads** has developed a new pilot program: Short-Term Housing Employment Program.

In addition to housing, this program accelerates the path to stability by requiring individuals to open a savings account to re-establish credit and save for a security deposit. Individuals meet regularly with a job coach and case manager to address workplace topics, develop a plan for housing and access eligible mainstream benefits.

As a result of receiving grant funding from St. Raphael's Special Appeal, U.S. Bank and Full Circle Foundation, DuPage**Pads** began this pilot program January 2015.

"When an individual who is homeless obtains employment, it is a pivotal moment in their life.

Providing short-term housing and support services allows people to have the ability to focus on their employment, without the distraction of not knowing where they will sleep, if they will have a shower and a place to keep their belongings," says Carol Simler, DuPage**Pads** President and CEO.

TOM, a machinist whose company closed several months ago found himself unemployed and eventually homeless. He was able to find a new job; unfortunately the company only had overnight shifts available.

Working the 3:00pm-3:00am shift, he would often sleep in his car. Remarkably he has never missed a day of work or been late for the start of his shift. Our staff saw his determination and enrolled him as the first participant in the new pilot program.

He shared, "I'm so grateful for this temporary home. I know firsthand how important this program is...now for the first time in months I can finally say I slept soundly after work."



Cleveland's Story – The Missing Smile

Cleveland stopped smiling in 1987. He was working a steady job when one day he came home to tragic news. His one-year-old son had been beaten to death by his baby sitter. Unable to cope, he stopped caring about his life.

"I just became angry at the world and turned to alcohol and drugs. I lost everything, my home, my family and ended up in prison. I could not handle the pain and walked around homeless for years."

When someone believes in you, everything can change.

Cleveland says the turning point in his life was DuPage**Pads**. In addition to basic needs like food and shelter, the agency connected him with a case manager who helped him find counseling and obtain needed medication.

Now Cleveland no longer uses alcohol or drugs and has reunited with his children. He is a tenant in DuPagePads Supportive Housing Program and says the best day of his life was when he opened his door to his new apartment.

Recently Cleveland was invited to tell his story in front of 450 people at DuPage**Pads**' 12th Annual Wake Up Your Spirit Breakfast where he moved the audience to tears. He shared:

"DuPage**Pads** was the only place that had the patience to work with me. They wanted me to get better, for myself and for my other children. My case managers made me want to be a better person.

One of the biggest changes people notice about me is that I now smile – DuPage**Pads** helped me get to this point.

I want to thank DuPage**Pads** for saving my life. I want to thank all of you for caring about me. God Bless you all!"

DuPage**Pads** Wake Up Your Spirit Breakfast - a great success. The agency raised approximately \$100,000 for our mission to end homelessness. Jarrett Payton was the captivating keynote speaker who inspired all through his family stories about philanthropy and working hard to be your best.
