GED Graduates Make the Grade!

While they have not yet donned a cap and gown, we want to congratulate two tenants in our Permanent Supportive Housing Program who are on the road to better opportunities! DuPage PADS initiated a partnership with the College of DuPage and Literacy Volunteers of DuPage to offer basic literacy and **General Educational Development** (GED) course preparation classes onsite at our Daytime Support Center. Catina and Michael completed the GED preparation classes and have now obtained their GED certificates. "It's not just the feeling of accomplishment for having reached this goal, but it is the chance to encourage other people to do the same. It's like, I did it, so can you," says Catina, the new graduate.

Instructors from the College of DuPage assist PADS participants in developing pre-GED reading and math skills in a PADS learning setting so that they are well prepared to take the exam and obtain their GEDs. "With this partnership in education and human services, we take a step that moves us closer to empowering people to become self-sufficient," according to Carol Simler, DuPage PADS Executive Director.

Earning their GEDs makes dollars and sense for Catina and Michael — and other program participants — not only in terms of better employment options, but also for the economic stability of their community. The long-term economic consequences of not graduating from high school are a reduction in lifetime earnings and contributions. "Getting a GED can be the difference between having and not having a job," says Sherry May, Adult Education and Workforce Development Program Manager at the College of DuPage. "This could be the doorway to a better job and going on to higher education and better pay."

Larry Cada, Employment Coordinator for DuPage PADS, adds, "This is another example of skills building to enable participants to find employment that will help them obtain and sustain housing. The ultimate goal is employment that will ensure housing

stabilization. Education, employment, and housing function together in helping end homelessness."

In addition to Catina and Michael, three participants in our Interim (Overnight) Housing Program have also obtained their GED certificates. increase in children who have no place to call home. Of the children served, 75 were under the age of 5.

Children experiencing the crisis of homelessness suffer physically and emotionally. The instability that results from homelessness causes tremendous stress for parents that can affect their psychological well-being and parenting behaviors. To address this issue, Case Manager Jill Tregler initiated Parenting Support Groups that focus on the struggles of parenting in a transient environment. Parents learn effective strategies for dealing with stress, using positive discipline, ensuring proper health and nutrition, and navigating the school system. The goal of the groups is to empower participants to parent successfully and transition out of homelessness and into their own homes. In addition, parents work one on one with dedicated case managers to identify and link them with the services they need to regain stability and move toward housing.

Last fiscal year, DuPage PADS served 119 families and 152 children, representing a startling 49% increase in the number of families seeking assistance and a 43%
