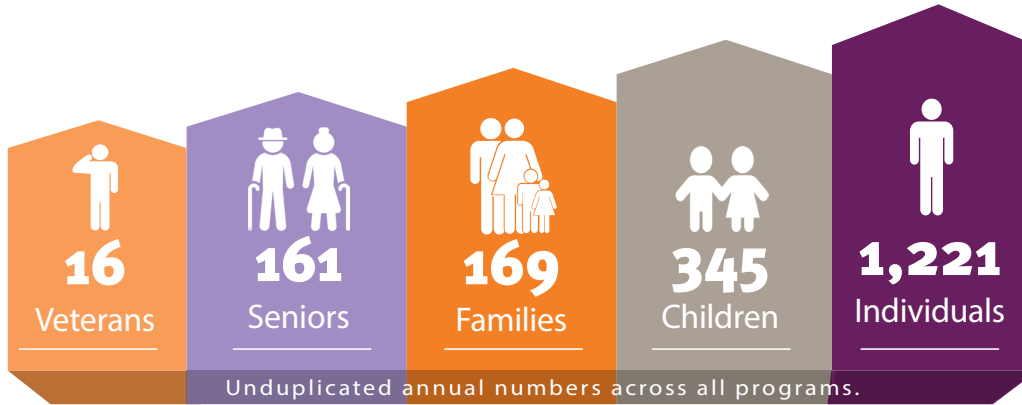


Who We Served (2024-2025)

Interim Housing Center

- 679 individuals sheltered.
- 109,204 nights of shelter provided.
- 327,612 fresh and frozen meals provided onsite, an average of 898 meals a day.

Permanent Supportive Housing

- 94% have had a place to call home for a year or longer.
- 147 households with support provided for 210 individuals, families and veterans, including 39 children and 46 survivors of domestic violence.
- 100% of rent payments made to property owners on time and in full.
- Supportive Housing offsets costs in every major public service category, saving taxpayers millions annually.

Rapid Rehousing

- 65 households serving 138 people.
- 100% retained their housing after entry.
- 28 individuals graduated successfully into a home of their own!

Housing Now

- Provides move-in and rental assistance with ongoing case management to households with income.
- 32 served in 14 households; 100% of households maintained housing.

Street Outreach

- Staff engaging with unsheltered individuals across 39 municipalities to provide shelter information and supportive services.
- 390 individuals served.
- 73% remained engaged and moved into shelter or housing.

Improved Community Health

- Over 60 health and social service partners working to improve the health of the most vulnerable community members.
- 521 individuals successfully managing one or more chronic health conditions once in a DuPagePads program.

IHC Family Services



117 families served, including
236 children

- Comprehensive support services to families engaged in case management at the Interim Housing Center.
- 46 families in shelter moved into stable housing.
- 145 children enrolled in school across 26 school districts while staying at the Interim Housing Center.

Empowerment Center

- Providing enrichment, employment, and empowerment groups weekly.
- 2,534 van rides provided.
- 378 participants in over 618 client groups and workshops.
- 48 financial and career-focused workshops provided.

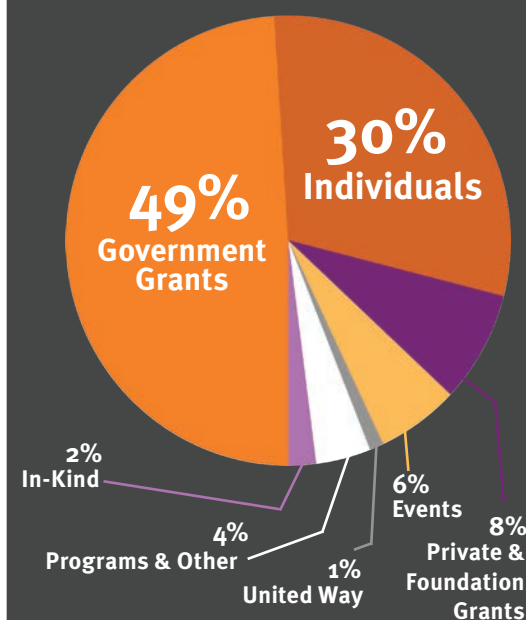
Education & Employment Services
