### Home for the Holidays **Twelve Homeless Families Move into Twelve New Apartments**

As 37-year-old Janice opened the door to her new apartment, her eyes swelled with tears. Gazing around the apartment she saw a couch, a table, a fully-furnished kitchen and to top it off, a small Christmas tree in the corner. "It's more wonderful than I could ever imagine," she whispers to her 10-year old-son.

"I'm so excited to have my own place, to decorate and to be with my son and granddaughter for the holidays. This will be the happiest Christmas I've had in ten years!" ~Kristen was homeless for 4 ½ years.

This year DuPage PADS welcomed 12 formerly homeless families and individuals into 12 new apartments right before the holidays. DuPage PADS is the largest provider of Permanent Supportive Housing in DuPage County and now provides a total of 76 apartments throughout the county.

The process for identifying residents for our permanent housing begins when individuals or families arrive at our Interim (Overnight) Housing sites or Client Service Center. From there, clients are provided with resources to rebuild their lives including: assistance in guided goal planning, counseling, parenting classes, educational opportunities, and employment preparation and placement.

For these clients, their apartments represent a fresh start and a way to come back to a place of dignity and belonging in our community. We are grateful for your support of our mission as well as the tremendous support of our partners in the community who helped make this happen.

# **Did You Know?**

### Homelessness occurs 365 nights a year.

Our greatest volunteer need occurs May through September. Last year 342 people, including 109 children, obtained independent housing throughout all DuPage PADS' programs.

DuPage PADS is the largest provider of Permanent Supportive Housing, with 76 apartments in DuPage County.

73% of those seeking employment found jobs through our Employment Program.

We have 20 employer partners, 10 of which were added last year.
