

### Three Inspirational Volunteers Selected out of 4,000

DuPagePads Announces Volunteer of the Year Award Winners

Volunteers are the heart and soul of DuPage **Pads**. In honor of this, the agency requested nominations for the Volunteer of the Year in two categories: Adult and Youth (age 13 to 18). A committee selected Diane Brown, Adult Winner and Ben Hall and Riya Uppal, Youth Winners.

In the early 1990s Diane Brown recommended that her congregation begin supporting DuPage**Pads**. Since then, she has organized 80 volunteers each month, successfully

advocated for showers to be included in church renovation and for her church to offer overnight sites Saturdays during the summer. Diane received her plaque as a surprise during a Sunday service and shares, "I accept this honor on behalf of my church family who has worked just as faithfully throughout the years."

Ben and Riya have been volunteering ever since they can remember. Riya said, "Every time I volunteered, it made a difference in one someone's life...I enjoy seeing the positive impact that one person can have."

Moved by their experiences, in 2010 the two created a cookbook and donated all of the proceeds to DuPage**Pads**. The pair have sold more than 500 copies and have just released the 2nd edition, "Cooking for Pads: The Sequel."

Ben and Riya received their award as a surprise in front of their peers at Hinsdale Central's Award Night. Ben said, "I was excited when they called our names. A lot of people help Pads in many ways, so it was surprising to know that our work had made an impact."

DuPage**Pads** currently has more than 4,000 volunteers and is recruiting more.

### Highlights from Sandra Hill's 21 Years of Service



During the blizzard of 2011, Sandra Hill's alarm rang at 2 a.m. Sandra struggled to walk to First Church of Lombard for her morning DuPage**Pads** shift, encountering snow drifts up to her hips. A few cars passed by and Sandra recalled, "They didn't even stop to see if we were ok. Then it hit me, this is what happens daily to those who are homeless. I felt empathy and I was grounded."

This is a moment that has stayed with Sandra as she reflects on her more than 21 years of volunteering with DuPage**Pads**. For 14 of those years she has been the Outreach Coordinator at First Church in Lombard. Before moving to New Orleans, Sandra reflects on her years of service and shares, "I'm excited for the future of DuPage**Pads**."

While DuPage**Pads** programs continue to evolve Sandra says, "What folks without homes really need is to become engaged with experts, and in this county it is DuPage**Pads**. I would encourage others to support the mission of DuPage**Pads**. We live in one of the richest counties, we should be outraged that homelessness exists and we should do something about it."
