When the economy crashed, I was working in manufacturing as a Production Manager. The orders stopped coming in. I was laid off and had no way to pay rent.

Thankfully DuPage PADS was there to offer overnight housing and nourishing meals. During the day at DuPage PADS' Employment and Education Center, I attended workshops on resume writing and was provided a number of resources. Computers were available for a job search.

The Employment Coordinator helped me update my resume, coached me for an

interview and even drove me because I didn't have transportation to get there. I got the job! DuPage PADS has been a real blessing for me.

I'm really grateful for being employed. I've now been working for 14 months, back in manufacturing. My job gives me a sense of accomplishment. With the absence of family, the company employees satisfy my need for family.

I still visit the people at DuPage PADS and give rides to people whenever I can. Now I can give back and help others.



Interim Housing (Overnight Assessment Centers)

DuPage PADS' Interim Housing program is designed to act more as an "intake assessment center" than a traditional "shelter". We provide men, women and children who are homeless with meals, shelter, safety and, most importantly, we act as a conduit to a network and support system that can mean permanent housing and employment.

DuPage PADS has grown to offer shelter 365 nights a year in 28 different congregations throughout the county, resulting in the agency being the largest provider of interim housing assessment centers in DuPage County.

Permanent Supportive Housing

The Permanent Supportive Housing program provides 76 affordable apartments and continued support services to families, individuals and veterans who have been homeless for one year or longer and have a disability.

This past fiscal year, DuPage PADS' Permanent Supportive Housing program served 104 individuals including 79 adults and 25 children.

Home Again

As a result of all of DuPage PADS' housing programs and supportive services, 342 individuals including 109 children obtained housing in our community.

Step by step, DuPage PADS reaches out to clients, first assessing and sheltering for the night, and then establishing trusting relationships that build confidence with families and individuals.

This results in individuals who are homeless being more likely to take advantage of a wide array of professional services and address the obstacles to obtaining housing.



DuPage PADS has developed a comprehensive approach to move men, women and children who are homeless into housing. The first step in accomplishing this mission is to engage individuals and families and provide them with opportunities for hope and change.

Life Skills Coaching

Professional Case Managers/Coaches skilled in substance abuse and mental health services work to develop relationships with each person, restoring self-esteem and helping individuals make positive life choices.

Support Groups

Support groups offer a safe environment to share, learn and grow. Some of the support groups facilitated by DuPage PADS' Case Managers include parenting groups, anger management groups and substance abuse education.

Client Service Center

PARTNERS WITH OVER 50 HEALTH, LEGAL & SOCIAL SERVICE AGENCIES.

DuPage PADS maintains a Client Service Center, open during regular business hours. Basic needs assistance such as food, support groups, access to case management, career and employment counseling are offered. All these services provide opportunities for clients to redirect their lives.

In order to most effectively leverage resources, DuPage PADS partners with more than 50 health, legal and social service agencies that continually provide their resources and expertise to stabilize clients who are homeless.

DuPage PADS recognizes that ending homelessness must include counseling and linking clients to resources and supportive services to rebuild their lives.

Employment Program

DuPage PADS' Employment Program provides skill assessments and helps clients establish an employment plan.

This onsite program provides a variety of services to help individuals gain meaningful employment through career preparation and placement with job coach support and retention strategies.

As a result of partnerships with College of DuPage and Literacy DuPage, DuPage PADS' clients can utilize on-site basic literacy and General Equivalency Diploma (GED) preparation courses to increase their employment marketability. Our Employment Team works with local businesses to place individuals in jobs.

This year 116 jobs were found for 158 clients seeking job assistance and to help achieve this, DuPage PADS established 10 new employer partnerships in the areas of manufacturing, healthcare, financial and various service industries.




